OUR SERVICES

By the grace of God, we will visit several newly established or emerging Coptic Christian communities in Bolivia and offer medical and spiritual care in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We will also visit an orphanage there, and possibly a facility for handicapped adults, and possibly a prison. At the varioius locations there will either be an opportunity to serve the people spiritually, medically, or both. Spiritual service will be through talks, songs, gifts, play, skits, liturgies, baptisms, prayers or just being present with the people.

The medical and dental service will include triage (vitals, chief complaint, intake information), exam by health professional, treatment plan made, treatment plan carried out if available (tooth extraciton, etc.), and presciption filled by our pharmacist from medications we bring with us.

ABOUT THE SERVICES

The Coptic Church in Bolivia began its service in Santa Cruz de La Sierra in December, 2000. The service there started in a tine, rented hounse situated in the northern zone of the November 23rd neighborhood. Father Youssef El Anba Boula began showing the Coptic Orthodox faith to his neighbors by celebrating liturgies, baptisms, weddings, retreats, and other activities. At the start of the evangelistic service there, there was only one Copt, but now the church is thriving and has many converts to the Orthodox faith. Some of the places that we will visit and serve are listed here.

ORPHANAGE

This is a house for children that are abandoned by their parents and families. This house for children is owned and operated by the Coptic Church in Bolivia and it serves children as young as a few days old. These children are truly the most vulnerable of society. There is a social worker on site and a nurse provides most of the daily needs of the children. Currently the capacity of the house is 8 children. All the needs of the children such as food, clothing, and medicine are provided there. The children are also baptised and are integrated into church life.

PUERTO BUSH

This is an encampment of families and various individuals who have occupied public land because they have nowhere else to live. They constructed for themselves makeshift huts and outhouses. The church has been reaching out to this group and going to them as much as possible with food, gifts, medicine, and some spiritual serives.

The group is at risk of being evicted from the public land but the church is committed to follow them to any new location so she can continue to serve them.

JUGAMOS APRENDER I & II

Translated, "We Play to Learn," these are several daycares that were built for the higher social class of Bolivia as a means of providing financial support for the other other social projects of the church that require constant income to help those in need, like the Saint Abram daycare.

SAINT ABRAM DAYCARE

This project was created to give young children a space to play in a safe environment, while their parents are at work. Many young children are left to play in the streets of left home alone and exposed to all kinds of dangers. It was also established as a way to help give moms a break to be able to complete grocery shopping and other household tasks. To this end, the daycare cares for the children in the area and gives them food and education. Children between the ages of 6 months and 4 years attend the daycare. If we visit the daycare, we can play with the children, sing to them, give them gifts or candy (if permitted by the staff), or do an activity like facepainting or a craft with them.

ST JOSEPH CARPENTRY

At Saint Joseph's carpentry shop, many projects are completed out of wood for many different uses around the chruch. This woodwork is done in the Coptic style, complimented by the work of the Bolivians. Some

of the works done there include: iconstasis, frames, engraved doors, altar tables, kitchen furniture, and beds. The works it done by hand and is not aided by CNC machines.

POPE SHENOUDA III MEDICAL CENTER

This health center provides primary medical and dental care for patients in the surrounding neighbrohoods. It provides consultations at reduced prices, bringing specialty campaigns and free surgeries carried out at participating hospitals, and health campaigns carried out by volunteer health professionals from America, Canada, and Europe.

<u>Departure</u> – Los Angeles (LAX) or your particular city, Sunday, July 17, 1:03 am flight (time will be different if from another desination) – COPA Flight 303, with layover in Panama (PTY) Flight 127

<u>Arriving</u> – Santa Cruz, Bolivia (VVI) at 9:49 pm (<u>must have this arrival time</u> <u>unless given excemption by trip</u> <u>organizers</u>)



For Return portion of trip:

Select Santa Cruz (VVI), Tuesday, July 26, 1:31 pm

(must have this departure time unless given excemption by organizers), COPA 220, with layover in Panama, connecting to COPA 302, returning to LAX (or another city of your choosing)

DEPOSIT (DUE IN JUNE)

Covers food and transportation in Bolivia. We are estimating this to be approximately \$400 per person for the duration of the trip.

YELLOW FEVER VACCINE

Yellow fever is the only Vaccine that is required for this trip. You must have this vaccine in order to get a visa to enter the country.

If you do not have it, please schedule an appointment with your Local health department,CVS pharmacy, Costco Pharmacy, or health care provider and receive it ASAP

OTHER VACCINES AND PREVENTATIVE MEDICATIONS TO CONSIDER BUT ARE NOT REQUIRED ARE:

• MALARIA MEDICATION TO TAKE WHILE THERE – RECOMMENDED. YOU CAN GET A PRESCRIPTION FROM YOUR PRIMARY CARE DOCTOR OR FROM YOUR LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

- TYPHOID VACCINE RECOMMENDED
- RABIES VACCINE OPTIONAL
- TETANUS SHOTS Recommended to up to date
- HEP A AND B SHOTS (HIGHLY RECOMMENDED)

WE MUST OBTAIN TOURIST VISAS TO ENTER BOLIVIA

 - o select TOURIST VISA
 - Approximate 10 business day turnaround time
 - o Requirement for the Visa
 - Valid U.S. passport with at least 6 months validity remaining.
 - International Certificate of Yellow Fever Vaccination (Must have proof of vaccination to submit with Visa application)
 - A 2 "x 2" passport size photograph
 - Proof of a round-trip ticket, or confirmation of plans to depart Bolivia.
 - Bank Statement (does not have to be full statement; needs to include name and availability of some funds to cover expenses in Bolivia)
 - With a visitor visa, you may stay up to 30 days per trip, but not exceed 90 days per year.
 - $_{\odot}$ A Bolivian visitor visa costs \$160 US and can be paid in U.S. dollars.
 - Visitors must also show proof of lodging in Bolivia, such as a hotel reservation. If staying with Bolivian friends or family, authorities may require a letter of invitation from the host. Our lodging is to be determined.
 - We can get letter from His Grace Bishop Youssef if we will be staying in the Church
 - If not staying in the church, we can use our hotel reservation.
 - Make sure you get entry and exit stamps from the Bolivian authorities every time you enter or leave Bolivia

G. Rules & Policies for the Mission Trip

- 1. To maintain the integrity and order of the Church, members and guests are required to abide by the following rules and policies—which are not exhaustive but serve as a guide and are subject to change.
- 2. To travel and participate in a Mission Trip abroad, a person **must be 18 years of age or older**. Younger travelers must be accompanied by at least one parent.
- 3. The Coptic Orthodox Church is first and foremost a holy place of worship which services its members and the community at large. In all its services and activities, it seeks to glorify Christ, strengthen our faith, enhance family relationships, develop future leaders, and unite all Christians.
- 4. Our Lord Jesus Christ is represented *in* us and revealed *by* our actions and behaviors. Our words and actions are to honor Him. Nothing and no one are to detract from our witness, testimony, and the message of the Bible and the Church.
- 5. For spiritual growth and fellowship with one another, Church members and guests are encouraged to participate and serve in Church services, activities, and Bible studies.

6. We must follow all the rules of our host church in Bolivia.

- 7. Participants must attend all mission activities.
- 8. Participants in Church services and activities should be appropriately dressed in accordance with the service and activity. No tank tops, shorts, or leggings may be worn by men or women during Divine Liturgy or Vespers.
- 9. All are expected to be respectful and punctual.
- 10. All socializing will be done in public areas of the Church property. No visiting is permitted in the Dormitories or hotel rooms occupied by members of the opposite sex.
- 11. The Church and its buildings are smoke, alcohol, and drug free. Use of alcohol on premises is forbidden.
- 12. Use of illegal drugs will not be tolerated and may be reported to local authorities.
- 13. As the house of God, the Church sanctuary must remain clean at all times. Participation in its cleanliness and maintenance is required. No food or drinks are allowed inside the Church. Prayer books and Bibles should be handled with respect and placed in their proper location at the end of each service.
- 14. The kitchen must remain clean at all times to prevent the spread of disease and insects. After using any kitchen equipment, supplies, and/or utensils, they must be thoroughly washed and maintained. All trash must be removed promptly.
- 15. Church bathrooms are to be kept clean at all times.
- 16. All trash bins in areas used by guests must be emptied daily. That includes dormitories, kitchen, meeting room, and dining rooms.
- 17. The Church Center in Bolivia provides mattresses, pillows, pillowcases, sheets, and blankets. Each person is expected to have his/her own towels and personal hygiene items.
- 18. The Church is not responsible for any loss resulting from negligence or inattention. Participants are responsible for any damage, alteration, or removal of Church property.
- 19. Any violation of the above Rules and Policies can result in expulsion. Cases of serious violations, such as possession of weapons or narcotics, will be dealt with more seriously.
